Children will improve their drawing techniques by exploring tone, texture and proportion to create more detailed artwork.



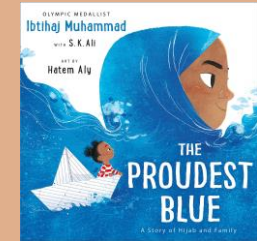
